LABOUR: COUNCIL TAX UP BY 6% THIS MONTH!

Council Tax in Wirral is going up by 6% this month. Cllr. Phil Davies, Labour Leader of the Council, has **said he is 'proud' of the budget. He has also pledged to introduce parking charges at Wirral's promenades and coastal areas.**

Wirral's opposition Conservative Councillors have called for less to be wasted on consultants and to scrap the Wirral View newspaper.

Conservatives also want to halt the plan for £1.5 million for food waste bins and loans to other councils.

"People in Moreton and Leasowe will see bills going up but little to show for it in our community.

"Instead, Labour Councillors are focussing on spending millions in

Birkenhead," said Moreton resident and Newsline Editor, Debbie Caplin.

Higher Council Tax also means those who were due to benefit next month from record increases in the state pension, the National Living Wage or the tax free allowance will, instead, be paying out more in Council Tax.

BACKING FOR WIRRAL'S RAPE & SEXUAL ABUSE CENTRE

Debbie Caplin, the new Editor of Newsline who lives here in Moreton, recently took the **Home Secretary, Amber Rudd MP, to meet with staff at Wirral's Rape & Sexual Abuse Centre.**

Jo Wood MBE, Chief Executive of the Centre said: "Many people still believe rape and sexual abuse only happens to 'someone else' but when 1 in 5 adult women and 1 in 8 adult men are reporting they have been a victim of sexual violence at some point in their lives, our specialist services will always be needed and will always be stretched to capacity."

Action in our community:

Action on fly posting:

Following another outbreak of posters being stuck to railings, fences and pedestrian crossings, we asked the Council for urgent action. As a result, around 200 were removed over the course of 24 hours. We are pressing for the company responsible to be prosecuted and fined.

Special schools:

Conservatives have called for urgent action following a report which revealed how Wirral's remaining special schools are struggling to meet demand, after Labour voted to close Lyndale School.

New LED street lighting:

Over the last few months we have reported several faulty or broken street lights for repair. The Council has now promised to install 500 new lights, around Wirral, which are less prone to faults and use less electricity. They have said the following lights will be replaced by the end of March:

Over the last 10 years, the number of community pharmacies has INCREASED by 1,500. Coastal parking charges are wrong, says Debbie Caplin



Debbie Caplin, seen at Leasowe Lighthouse with Councillor Chris Blakeley, has pledged to oppose the charges.

Labour Councillors, including those representing this area, have voted to impose parking charges on people using our coast.

The move follows the earlier introduction of parking charges in our Country Parks.

The charges will be introduced at Leasowe Lighthouse, as well as Kings Parade in Wallasey, North

Parade in Hoylake and South Parade in West Kirby.

Conservative Councillors in the Town Hall, led by former Leasowe & Moreton East Councillor, Ian Lewis, have called for the charges to be scrapped and, instead for less money to be spent on management consultants.

Debbie said: "Labour Councillors say they need to introduce the charges to raise £250,000 but are quite happy to spend £2.6 million on expensive consultants. It doesn't make sense and it's really

disappointing that the three Labour Councillors for this area have gone along with the plan."

Debbie added: "Like so many other residents of Moreton and Leasowe, I regularly visit Leasowe Common and walk along the embankment.

"These charges will deter people from using this wonderful local amenity."

PLAN TO SAVE OUR GREEN BELT DELAYED FOR TWO YEARS!

In the last edition of Newsline, we reported on **the Town Hall's failure to produce a plan to protect Wirral's Green Belt, 13** years after it was due.

Replying to the Government, the Leader of the Council failed to explain why almost every council had managed to comply with the law.

Instead, Councillor Davies said it would take Wirral Council another two years, during which time any number of new threats from developers could emerge.

However, following changes by the Government, Wirral Council has an extra £240,000 to spend within the Planning Department.

Conservative Councillors want some of that money to be used to enforce existing planning controls and to also produce a plan for the Green Belt sooner than 2020.

£6m GRANT FOR WIRRAL COUNCIL

The Government has given Wirral Council a grant of £6 million to help build more homes on brownfield sites, relieving pressure on our Green Belt.



YOUTH UNEMPLOYMENT IN WIRRAL FALLS AGAIN

The number of 18-24 year olds out of work in Wirral has fallen again - down to 880 in January, compared to 2,540 five years ago.

This month also saw a big push to promote National Apprenticeship Week, as part of a plan by the Conservatives to work with employers to create more apprenticeships. The last year saw 491,000 apprenticeships created.

April will also see the National Minimum Wage increased to £7.38 for those aged 21-24, up from £4.92 an hour under Labour.

Debbie Caplin said: "Every school leaver in Moreton and Leasowe must have the opportunity to

choose the future they want, **whether it's continuing at college or university, a job or apprenticeship or starting their own business.** We can only do this with a strong economy, with lower taxes on jobs and the businesses that create the jobs."

TOWN HALL REPORT:

Library and Leisure Review: a report by consultants, costing Wirral taxpayers £284,000, **won't be published until AFTER** the Council elections in May. The review looks at how libraries, leisure centres can be delivered 'differently'!

Child grooming report: Conservative Councillors have continued to challenge the decision not to publish the report into the recent cases of child sexual exploitation in Birkenhead, in spite of attempts to silence them. We **want the authorities' failures** to be published, while protecting the victims.

Extreme 'left wing' takeover: Wirral's Labour Party is being taken over by the hard-left Momentum Group. Their Cabinet Member for Finance has, meanwhile, stated she is a Marxist. Nationally, Corbynally, Chris Williamson MP, has called for Council Tax to be doubled!

'No' to voting security plan: Five councils will be in a scheme to improve the security of voting at elections, after the number of cases of impersonation doubled between 2014 and 2016. **Wirral's Labour Councillors** voted against taking part.

M53 Junction 1 lights: The Council has been given £100,000 by the Government towards the cost of introducing traffic controls at Junction 1 of the M53 (the 'B&Q roundabout').
