## LESLEY RENNIE REPORTS BACK...

Lesley, along with Paul Hayes and Ian Lewis, fights for a fair share of Wirral Council's £800 million budget for our community, while Labour Councillors vote to put Birkenhead first.

### MAGENTA LIVING FLATS:

We are working with tenants and residents of the flats in Wallasey Village to make their landlord, Magenta Living, tackle the poor quality of the windows and improve the communal areas.

### WALLASEY VILLAGE STATION:

At the last two elections in Wallasey, Labour candidates have promised to act on the poor access at the station. They haven't been seen since. Labour Councillors have, however, supported works at stations in Birkenhead. Lesley, Paul and Ian will continue to fight for a share of the money available to improve access for pensioners, the disabled and parents with prams and buggies.

### SEAVIEW ROAD REPAIRS:

We continue to push for this road to be repaired - and not using the same process that subsequently failed at Wallasey Road!

### DEFIBRILLATORS INSTALLED:

Thank you to everyone who has been in touch following our work to have life-saving defibrillators installed outside Windsor's and Castle Carpets in the Village.

### ST GEORGE'S SCHOOL SURVEY:

We continue to work with the school to improve road safety at both sites. New barriers will be installed at St George's Road and a safer road surface outside the school is planned. We have also asked parents for their views and suggestions.

### REMEMBER:

Only Lesley Rennie, Paul Hayes and Ian Lewis keep in touch on local issues all year round.

## GOOD NEWS IF YOU LIVE IN WALLASEY. NOT SO GOOD IF YOU LIVE IN LEASOWE...

Thanks to work by our Councillors, Lesley Rennie, Paul Hayes and Ian Lewis, the Town Hall has agreed to spend £344,000 over the next year on important road repairs here in Wallasey Ward.

In Moreton West & Saughall Massie, Conservative Councillors there have also secured cash for their area.

However, in Leasowe, with three Labour Councillors, not a SINGLE road is in the programme for repairs.

That's the difference good councillors make: let's vote to keep them!



## Lesley Rennie: where I stand

### 1 COASTAL CAR PARKING CHARGES:

Thank you to everyone who signed my petition against them. Labour Councillors are throwing money at consultants, while hitting residents with parking charges.

### 2 OUR LOCAL NHS:

I support our NHS and want a fair share for Wirral of the extra £10 billion being invested in it. The recent pay rises announced for NHS staff (up to 29% for the lowest paid), are really good news.

### 3 MANAGEMENT CONSULTANTS:

£2.6 million has been spent in the last 12 months while the Labour Council claims it has 'no money' for services.

### 4 WIRRAL VIEW NEWSPAPER:

Scrap it! Labour Councillors have spent £254,000 on it so far, with another £140,000 to come. Use the money to reintroduce school crossing patrols instead, such as at St George's Primary upper site.

### 5 WALLASEY FIRE STATION:

Along with Labour and Liberal Democrat Councillors, I voted for the Fire Authority budget to further our aim to avoid firefighter redundancies.

### 6 POLICING AND CRIME:

I patrolled these streets as a former Police Officer and I know the area well. My priority now is to support victims and do more to see criminals brought to justice.

### 7 FOOD WASTE BINS:

Another waste of money! The cost has now been estimated at £1.5 million. I questioned a Town Hall Director about the plan and he confirmed they still want to give every home two bins for food waste.

### 8 ACCOUNTABLE TO YOU:

Unlike councillors in other parts of Wirral, I put the needs of our community first, and party politics second.

I work with Paul and Ian to keep in touch with residents all year round. Because we work as a team, we can work together on local issues.

And, unlike the Wirral View, our newsletters don't cost taxpayers a single penny!
