### Extra **£200m** for Wirral Council

Over the last year, your local Conservative Councillors have been working to make sure local shops and businesses receive their share of more than **£200m** extra from the Government given to Wirral.

Now, more is on the way: the latest Restart Grants of up to £18,000 are available, depending on the type of business.

New plans announced:

### Better deal for tenants

Thank you to everyone in Moreton who replied to the recent survey from Max on housing issues.

Max, Steve and Bruce are working on the problems raised.

There was strong backing from tenants for the Government's plans to require housing associations, such as Magenta Living, to provide smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in all homes.

The proposed new Social Housing Charter will also improve tenant rights.

### Tackling grass verges

One of the big issues for local residents is the poor condition of many of the grass verges.

Residents in Town Meadow Lane, and many roads nearby, are unhappy that the Council has said it can't deal with the mess caused by vehicles overriding the grass.



### Moreton Cross:

**Thank you to those volunteers who have maintained the planters around Moreton Cross over the last 12 months.**

Max, Steve and Bruce are keen to support the shops and small businesses and to help them recover from the pandemic. That's one of the reasons why we opposed Labour's plan for parking charges in our town.



### 372 more police:

**Tackling crime and anti-social behaviour in Moreton is a priority for Max, Steve and Bruce.**

With 20,000 extra police being recruited nationally, so far 372 have been put on the streets of Merseyside. We also want more action on scrambler bikes and speeding vehicles on local roads.



### Youth Club:

**Providing safe, positive activities for young people in Moreton helps to keep many of them off the streets.**

Following our campaign, the Town Hall has agreed to include a new youth facility at Moreton Cross as part of the wider development of the area.



### Protect green spaces:

**One of the important issues in this area is flooding and poor drainage.**

That's why Max, Steve and Bruce do not support building more houses on the flood plain around Moreton. As well as protecting these areas, we also want to see more of the money given to Wirral for tree planting to be used in Moreton.
